

It was a night of emotion and hope as Monique Story shared with us about Quinn's Place, a Friday night gathering place in Mornington for our young folk, named in honour of her beloved son Quinn whose life was cut short last year.

Alongside Monique was Rosie and Sergeant Patrick Hayes from Mornington Police who spoke about Communication, Compassion and Courage, attributes that epitomises Monique and her family as they help other young people like Quinn find hope at perhaps their greatest time of need.









Quinn's Place is bringing teens together

The detrimental effects of COVID lockdowns on teeragers can't be understated. The disruption to school, casual jobs, playing sport, and the lack of face-to-face contact with friends meant their mental health suffered, and for some the impacts continue.

Mornington resident and mother of four Monique Story wants to do everything she can to support young people in the community. Monique knows first hand the depths of despair supporting a teen going through tough times and mental health challenges can bring.

Just over a year ago, her youngest son Quinn died at 17 in mysterious dircumstances. "Our family are living with unanswered questions," Monique said. "People in the community are coming up with their own answers, but the coroner is continuing investigations for another six months."

Morrique said Quinn's life was never the same after he witnessed a horrfic accident when he was 14. "No one really knows or understands, except for my dose friends, what our family has been through over the past few years."

A grief counsellor suggested Monique write down how she was feeling. "I started writing and it became the story of Quinn's life. He went from being the most adorable fourth child in our family to someone who was battling to stay alive every day." Monique didn't set out to write a book but found writing so helpful that often she wrote through the night.

In the early days of her overwhelming grief, a goal became clear: to create a teen hangout in honour of Quinn's life and share the kindness he was known for. Thanks to the support of Father Geoff Mollroy at St Macartans Parish, Quinns Place became a reality in May. Father Mollroy's input was invaluable in making Quinn's Place a success.

Located in the community house at St Macartan's in Drake St, Mornington, Quinns Place is open on Fridays from 6-l0pm. Quinn's dad, Andy Story, and his brothers Tripp, Sid and Hunter are there each Friday right jamming in the music room with whoever wants to join in. There's an Xbox room, table tennis, a pool table, and space just to meet friends, sit around and talk. Food is generously supplied by nearby businesses including Yabbies Fish and Chippery & Burger Bar, DOC Pizza and Rebel Donuts.

"We're getting some kids who've been staying in their bedrooms for weeks or years even since lookdown, whose mental health has been affected," Monique said. "Parents are convincing their kids to come and then the kids have come back, which is great."

The night I visit Quinn's Place, the mood is relaxed and buoyant. Everyone is made welcome, parent volunteers that in the kitchen and teenagers hang out. Even though I've never met Quinn, it's easy to imagine from his beaming smile in the photo at the entance that he'd be proud of what his family have created to honour his life.

"There have been positives that have come out of this time," Monique said. "Quinn's Place is just the beginning."
