Greetings Rotarians and Friends

February is Peace Building and Conflict Resolution Month, so I wanted to share with you an interesting article that was found on the Rotary Down Under Website.

To Summarize, its an article that discusses Conflict Resolution, not in a 'War Torn' country, but within our Rotary Community!

How can we contribute to Peace Building activities effectively if we don't address any conflict within our own Rotary Clubs?

The article explains that many Rotarians leave clubs because they feel that they may have not been spoken to appropriately or feel that their views are not being heard. We need to make sure that we fully understand what is being presented or discussed before we offer our opinion. Constructive criticism is crucial. I like to offer my help, rather than give negative feedback!

Also mentioned is the catch phrase 'Get curious before you get furious' meaning Why did you say that? Why did you do that? Before you get angry! Many people will let loose! And walk out the door. What we need to do is sit down, calm down and diffuse the situation. As we know an email can often be deciphered incorrectly or even a text message, that's why they invented emojis! We need to make sure we fully understand what is being communicated, so we can avoid conflict through misunderstanding.

The article lists five (5) strategies for conflict resolution.

- 1 Recognise that all of us have biased fairness perceptions.
- 2 Avoid escalating tensions with threats and provocative moves.
- 3 Overcome an 'Us vs Them' mentality.
- 4 Look beneath the surface to identify deeper issues.
- 5 Separate negotiable from non-negotiables

Rotary Overseas Repurposed Playgrounds (RORP) update by Rotarian Wayne Jenkins

From a RORP aspect, I thought I would update you on our challenges and potential timelines.

Challenges that are not in our control are:

- The lack of availability of Shipping Containers in the Southern Hemisphere.
- The lack of transparency of financial costings, so we can plan.

Now having said that, it is still our plan to despatch Container C12 to Cape Town in May 2022 with eleven playgrounds loaded.

To help us achieve our objectives, another District RORP Co-ordinator (D9810) and ourselves in D9820 have created another transport potential by dealing directly with the transport industry, hence we am now waiting on advice from Cargo Masters here in Melbourne....prior to that we have relied on Rotary's "DIK" to undertake the shipping logistics.

Presently we have six playgrounds here in the workshop / storage with a bunch more in the system prior to May 2022, so the supply and destination are not our hassle, rather the logistics/unknown cost of the middle bit of our task.

But let's be positive....!!!

The three active RORP Districts here in Victoria have requests for Containers of playgrounds in:

- Sri Lanka
- Egypt x 2
- Fiji
- PNG
- India
- Cape Town
- Philippines





so its going to be a fun year ... at least 70 playgrounds!!

As soon as I hear from Cargo Master (Or DIK) I will share that advice with you.
