outlooks and ideas from both men and women of all ages. As well as the four women, we have thirty four men and six honorary members.



Foreward

From the beginning of Rotary with Paul P. Harris in 1905 you can only imagine the spread of goodwill and service that this wonderful organisation, to which we belong, has delivered across the world. From one Club in one Country to one hundred and nine years on, today we see 34,336 Clubs, across 530 Districts and 215 Countries with 1,228,788 Rotarians across the world all dedicated to a common cause of Service Above Self. From the vision of one man in 1905 we arrive at the vision of The Rotary Club of Mornington in 1973 to expand Rotary within their District and investigate the formation of a new Rotary Club. With guidance from DG Lindsay Patison and his Special Representative Past President Bill Mackenzie we saw on the 18th of March, 1974 the first official meeting of the Interim Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha. On the 8th of April 1974 the official Charter for the Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha was granted by Rotary International. And so began the life of a community body of twenty six men which ultimately, on July 1st, 1978 changed its name to better reflect its demographics and became The Rotary Club of Mt Martha that we know today.

Today we thank those with that vision and those twenty six Charter Members led by Charter President Barry Taylor for this club which today celebrates the fortieth anniversary of that first meeting. From those first days this Club has been strong in its support of its community Mt Martha and Mornington. The fire brigades, the lifesaving clubs, the Bay Rescue Service (now VMR), the Briars property, our pre-schools and primary schools, the playgrounds, the Balcombe Estuary, the Mornington Information Centre, Mornington Peninsula Youth Enterprises, Fusion, Kankama, Ozanam Industries, Schools Chaplaincy, the disadvantaged, the aged and needy, to name but some the club has focused on in our community. Many from day one to now still receive our support. A number we also thank as they continue to support us.

The Club has long supported the youth in our area. International Youth Exchange Program, youth leadership (RYLA), and life enrichment (RYPEN) programs, the Rotaract Club, school art shows, junior community awards, citizenship encouragement, science summer schools, science experiences, Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA), career counselling and peer support programs are but some of the many opportunities we have offered to our youth.

Through our vocations we have endeavoured to set examples of behaviour that uphold the Rotary Ideals. Our engagement with the Group Study Exchange program has given young men and women people great experiences. Our business seminars and lunches with notable speakers have been widely accepted in our business world. Internationally we have keenly supported the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International, given of our time and funds to put aid into needy projects and communities around the world. Polio Plus, ROMAC, FAIM, ARHF, and Donations in Kind, to name but a few.

As Rotarians we thank all who have supported us on this Rotary journey. In particular our wives, husbands and families who without we would not have the success we have achieved.

<u>The Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha</u>

The Beginning

In late 1973, Rotary District 282 and The Rotary Club of Mornington, which had then a membership exceeding eighty members, began to investigate the establishment of a new Rotary Club in their area. District Governor Lindsay Patison appointed a Special Representative, Past President Bill Mackenzie to lead the research and investigation which led to the formation of The Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha.

The following reporting has been extracted from past bulletins of the club:-

The Interest Meeting Wednesday March 13th 1974

Immediately following their regular meeting The Rotary Club of Mornington hosted a meeting, chaired by President Bob Smith, with some 40 Rotarians and citizens regarding the formation of a new Rotary club to be established in the area known as Mornington South – Mt Martha. That area being bounded by a line down the centre of Main St, Mornington and Mornington Tyabb Road to Derrill Road, Moorooduc, then along Ellerina Road and then along the coast of Port Phillip Bay to Mornington, having been conceded from the then boundary of The Rotary Club of Mornington.

Also present were District Governor Lindsay Patison and District Governor Nominees Don Pittard (1974/75) and Arthur Pullen (1975/76) and Past District Governors Keith Norman and George Allsop. The chairmanship of the meeting was passed to the District Governor's Special Representative (DGSR) Past President (PP) Bill Mackenzie who following the Rotary International Manual of Procedure led the establishment of the new Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha.

Following protocol, keen discussion and adroit chairmanship the meeting duly elected to office President Barry Taylor, Secretary Jack Grigg and Treasurer Alan Dowdle, with Past President Bill Mackenzie appointed Club Service Director. A club admission fee of \$20 was set with an annual fee of \$26. The first meeting of the new club was set for 6:30 pm on Monday 18th March at Whelan's Dava Hotel Mt Martha.

District Governor Lindsay Patison commended the Rotary Club of Mornington for sponsoring the new club and congratulated DG's SR PP Bill Mackenzie for his leadership and work in this endeavour. President Bob Smith endorsed those remarks in closing the meeting. Earlier PP Bill had read the names of prospective members of the new club including Mornington Rotarians PP Bill Mackenzie, PP Alan Dowdle, Barry Taylor, Jack Grigg, Mike Harding, Don Kerr, Dick Chapman, and Sonny Cross. Also named were Arthur Care from Rotary Club of Thomastown and Harry Simpson Rotary Club of Melbourne and local citizens Bob Hamilton, Bert Niblett, David Archer, John Grant, Kevin Akers, Ken Fyffe, Vic Bowen, Geoff Maughan, Alex Weaver, Alby Brierley, Ron Hicks, Shane Whelan, Warren Smith, Daryll Wise, Peter Barker, Ellis Waters, Richard Nutt, Lewis Firman, Peter Stevenson, John Kett, Lou Da Costa, and Bill Jones.

<u>The First Meeting</u> Monday March 18th 1974

President Barry occupied the chair for the first time welcoming those twenty members present, eight former members of the Rotary Club of Mornington, one from the Rotary Club of Thomastown and eleven men new to Rotary. Whelan's Dava Hotel was a pleasant environment and promptly served a delicious meal to a happy and enthusiastic group. President Barry initiated business detailing the Clubs structure, its four main service committees and their purpose, ably assisted by Club Service Director Bill Mackenzie. Classifications were explained and former Rotarians drew on their experience in this. Past District Governor George Allsop was to be invited to address the club on Rotary Information.

It was resolved that no new members were to be admitted during the next six months and members were advised of the 14 steps to the method of selecting members. Before closing the first meeting President Barry asked members to give thought to certain points raised for consideration at the next meeting. The points were: 1. Drinks service during meetings. 2. Nomination of office bearers. 3. Payment of dues.

And so the first meeting closed and fellowship continued as does the Rotary of Mount Martha forty years hence from that date.

<u>March 1974 – June 1974</u> <u>Interim President Barry Taylor — Club Programs</u>

At the new clubs third meeting it had its first guest speaker, Mr Ray Johnson who gave a vivid and graphic description with a colour slide presentation of his visit to Nepal in 1972. The following week was a presentation by Mr McNaughton of the Prisoners Aid Society, HM Prison, Pentridge. This lead to the clubs first service project collecting men's shoes for the society.

Later programs included PDG Keith Norman presenting on The Rotary Foundation and members Ellis Waters and Bill Mackenzie doing a Q&A of Rotary Information. The wives of members joined for lunch at the home of President Barry and Dorothy and member Arthur Care gave an entertaining job talk. Members Lou Da Costa spoke on photography and Mike Harding on gliding. Thirteen members and two tractors assisted clearing the Mt Martha Pre-School site in Watsons Rd and 37 on a bus trip to see the film "Mame" starring Lucille Ball rounded out a busy run up to the clubs Charter Night on July 12 1974.

The Presentation of Charter

The Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha

Report on our Charter Night, 12th July, at Whelan's Dava Hotel It was our most auspicious night! About 220 were in attendance, with the top brass in local Rotary International officers present: District Governor Don Pittard & Shirley, PDG Lin Patison & Meg, PDG George Allsop & Val, PDG Keith Norman & Gwen, DG Nominee Arthur Pullen & Phyl, PDG Royce Abbey & Jean of District 280; and Club guests Cr. Graeme Otte & Mrs. Otte (who deputised for the Shire President & Mrs. Gibson), and the Rev. Dr. A. Watson. Among the apologies were those of PDG John Emerton and PP Arthur Care, our single club absentee detained in N.Z. Chairman for the evening was P.P. Bob Smith of our Sponsor Club, the Rotary Club of Mornington, who, after the invocation by Rev. Lewis Firman and the Loyal Toast, welcomed all present and introduced visiting Rotarians. Dr. Watson responded, saying that the new Rotary Club of Mornington South-Mt. Martha would reinforce Rotary relationships in this area and he welcomed the club and its charter members into the worldwide body of Rotary International. Sergeants-at-Arms Charles Arter and John Grant combined most successfully in extracting fines with excellent humour. P.P. Bill Mackenzie, as D.G's Special Representative in negotiations to get the club going, reported on the progress of events and thanked all those senior R.I. officers who had given him outstanding help in his task. With Barry Taylor as the Charter President, the new Club, said Bill, must reach out into the community to serve. D.G. Don Pittard then inducted all 25 members present and handed to each the Rotary lapel badge known all over the world. Don addressed the gathering, presenting many thoughtful and challenging sentiments, urging the new members to aim at dedication, commitment and personal involvement in Rotary. He said Rotary's first job was to build men, and both old and new Rotarians need to persevere in the principles of Rotary. The honor of presenting the Club Charter went to P.D.G. Lin Patison who was D.G. at the time of our club formation. Lin presented to President Barry Taylor his chain of office and the Club Charter. Barry, in reply, accepted the office and Charter with an expression of special thanks to the Sponsor Club, the Rotary Club of Mornington, with P.P. Bob Smith as leader and P.P. Bill Mackenzie as D.G's Special Representative. Many banners from the 25 Rotary Clubs represented on the night were handed over to President Barry; Jack Saxton (Frankston) told us of the fines box he gave, PDG Keith Norman donated our new lectern, the Rotary Club of Dromana a R.F. Box, District 282 Rotarians a gavel and bell, and a framed photograph of the Queen came from PDG Lin. Secretary Jack Grigg in acknowledging these inspiring gifts, thanked the donors for their tangible assistance to a young club such as ours. Finally, PP Bob Smith thanked all who attended and congratulated Shane

Whelan and his staff for providing an excellent setting, music & dinner.





1976 — 1977 President David Archer

Changeover "A Night of Stars" saw a poetry recited by a hobo-janitor with an awful cough named Nick and gala performances by Shirley Temple (Mike Harding), The Andrews Sisters (Maughan, Kerr & Hamilton) and a morality play among other acts. David Archer was installed as President.



In closing this overview of The Rotary Club of Mt Martha's first forty years we could remind ourselves of the ideals of Rotary and what our Club stands for by reflecting on The Four–Way Test of the things we think, say and do. What will we respond to those questions of -

I believe yes we can say without question that The Rotary Club of Mt Martha has put Service Above Self, and it has fairly applied the Four—Way Test as it celebrates forty years of service supporting our Local Community, Our International Community, our Youth and Our Vocations.

Balcombe Creek Estuary Park and Boardwalk

In 1985, the club identified development of the old Balcombe Creek Caravan Park into a Recreational Park as a major project for the club. The Mornington Shire Council agreed and so commenced the major focus of the club for the next decade. Now the Department of Housing and Planning has advised the Rotary Club that its application for funds for information boards has been approved.

Working in co-operation with local environmental groups, the club plans to produce and erect six to eight boards featuring the flora, fauma, topography and history of the area.

chitect, Geoff Kaye has been in-volved with the Balcombe estuary area since the club became involved.

During Winter (and the Spring of '92) the boardwalk gives a high and dry access and interesting perspective to a patch of dense bushland that has until now been inaccessible.



The Mt Martha Lifesaving Club Clubhouse




This project is a legacy of Past President John Sheeran who in 1992 had the vision of converting the Mt Martha Lifesaving Club rooms from a rundown former fishing and boat hire shack into a facility to fittingly and properly serve the needs of the youth of Mt Martha.

Regulations required that we demolished and rebuild the rear of the existing building and then refurbish the front half. We could not just build a new facility. Many club members contributed none more so than Community Director Wal Wedgwood Service monitored and drove the project. He garnered the \$50,000 funding from various trusts, the Shire Council, Royal Lifesaving Society and our own club fundraising. Club expertise was availed upon. Among them architect Geoff Kaye, builders Len DeBono and John Grant, Peter Barker plumbing and Max McFarlane along with most other club electrician members, local contractors and ten working bees got the job done.

From February 1993 to hand over in March 1994 we saw completion of one of the clubs most satisfying achievements. Today the Mt Martha Lifesaving Club after two more recent rebuilds supports over 700 members and has become recognised as one of the premier life saving clubs in Victoria. A community achievement which we can be very proud of.







FAIM (Fourth Avenue in Motion) project to Indonesia in 1985

A Rotary FAIM (Fourth Avenue in Motion) project to Indonesia in 1985 providing sewing machines to Kebon, Central Java. Bryce Thomson arranged a donation of sewing machines to a village in Indonesia in 1985 or 86. Treadle machines, they were, as no power in the villages. Bryce and Jean Thomson, Peter and Sandra Barker, Judy and Geoff Kaye and friends of the Thompsons, Len and Margaret, presented the machines to the village. In Indonesia, primary education is free but students must have the school uniform. The women of the village made the uniforms for their children and also sold to other villages, using 'our' machines.







2006 — Bali Matching Grant — Clean water project, school supplies

In 2005, the club received a District Simplified Grant which funded the provision of additional water tanks and drinking fountains at a school located in Ahmed, an area of East Bali afflicted with extreme poverty. The grant provided the students with clean fresh drinking water.

In September 2006, nine members and partners of the Rotary Club (Tom and Gayle Goulding, their daughter Ashley, Merv and Christine Williams, Steve and Gwen Daly, Howard and Sandra Roy) teamed up with members of the Rotary Clubs of Ubud and Bali Seminyak to visit schools in the Ubud area and Ahmed, an area of East Bali afflicted with extreme poverty.

A Rotary Foundation Matching Grant totalling US\$23,000 was established to provide reading books, teaching and learning materials and educational consumables to enable poor village families to send their children to school. The funding of classroom materials was dependent on the school entrolments - Amed Lean School (225), Amed Tukabase School (170, Amed Bangle (188) and Ubud Singakerta School (188). School toilets were cleaned, repaired and renovated through the provision of improved toilet systems, water piping, showers and tiling of floors and walls.

Service to District 9820

Throughout our clubs forty years we have lent our support to the running and administration of our Rotary District. We have had many members serve on District committees and run programs for District 9820. Youth Exchange, RYLA, RYPEN, The Rotary Foundation, The Portsea Camp, Group Study Exchange, Centurion Club, NYSF, ROMAC, Australian Rotary Health, District Training, Assistant Governor and most likely others roles I have missed.

Administratively there can be nothing a club could be more proud of than a member being inducted as the District Governor. The Rotary Club of Mt Martha is no exception and we can proudly boast of three outstanding Rotarians from our club who have been awarded that honour. In 1989 Arthur Care became the first from our Club to the office of District 9820 Governor. Arthur was closely followed by Rob Marks as District Governor for 1995-96 and in 2010-11 David Piper led our District. In 2015, we will in Merv Williams have the fourth District Governor of District 9820 from our Club. This will be the most DG's from one club in this District since our Charter was granted in 1974. Along with the responsibility of being DG's home club usually go the District administrative roles of secretary, treasurer and other position of support. Not to mention the running of three District Conferences. Twice in Ballarat and once in Shepparton our Club has conducted District Conferences of the highest standard.

Since 2001, Past District Governor David Crane has been a member of the club. He served as 9820 District Governor in 1998 — 1999, whilst a member of the Rotary Club of Hazelwood.




