














Rotary Club of Mount Martha Christmas Raffle

This year the Rotary Club of Mount Martha will be conducting a Christmas Raffle. The 1st prize is a Samsung 65cm 4K TV valed at \$1,200, 2nd prize is a \$500 Bunnings voucher, 3rd prize is a \$400 Ritchies IGA and 4th prize is a Christmas Hamper from Mornington Peninsula Hampers (thank you Kate for your generous support) valued at over \$300. RORP REBRANDING

Over the past few months, the RORP Founder and District Coordinators have discussed and agreed on a subtle change to the RORP Branding.

RORP is still RORP, however the full title is now:

Rotary Overseas Relocated Playgrounds

The main reason we decided on this small change is the environmentally negative aspects of the word "Recycled" rather than the more neutral wording of "Relocated". Regardless of the environmental aspect, the word "Relocated" more accurately identifies what we actually do within the RORP program.

We also thought the perception of others is important as to what we do with these playgrounds, when for instance they see the RORP Trailer heading along the freeway stacked with a playground onboard. is it heading to Sims Metal for mulching and recycling?

RECYCLING VS RELOCATING:

Relocating ensures that the program:

Maximises the reduction in the Carbon Neutrality equation (Smaller Carbon Footprint) Minimises' any Recycling (by relocating)

Minimises' (if not eliminates) the local use of Land Fill (Plastic and wooden components remain intact)

"Relocating" reflects a positive contribution to the various Environmental Polices, including the initiative of Rotary International with our 7th Area of Focus – Environment.

Rob Davies has taken the initiative by asking Progress Signs to adjust that one word on the rear of the RORP Trailer.
