

BAYS HOSPITAL CANCER CENTRE DONATION CHEQUE PRESENTATION

Last Monday afternoon, PP Carol and Treasurer Byron presented a cheque for \$2,000 to The Bays Healthcare Group as a Donation towards the new Comprehensive Cancer Centre to be built at the Bays Hospital in Mornington.

We had recently heard from Jade Phelan, the CEO of The Bays Healthcare Group at a Club meeting.

As you would be aware the Bays is a stand-alone not for profit community healthcare provider which operates The Bays Hospital in Mornington & The Bays Aged Care & Dialysis Centre in Hastings. When Jade spoke at the Club meeting she mentioned the exciting changes coming to The Bays Mornington. Currently, there are no radiation oncology services, and limited chemotherapy and cancer support services, on the Mornington Peninsula. Patients are required to travel to Frankston and beyond for their treatment and support services. The Bays Comprehensive Cancer Centre will change this. It will provide the community with local access to complete cancer care services.

Also coming to Mornington is the Rehabilitation & Wellness Hub which will be built in conjunction with the Alexandra Park Precinct Project.

I have no doubt we will hear more about these exciting projects for our Community over the coming months.

Cranes 4 Ukraine

Please read the story below.

I still have Cranes 4 Ukraine for sale, please see me (Byron) at the Club meeting this week to purchase yours, we have raised \$140 to date and would like to get to \$200. They are only \$5, a small donation really.

Cranes for Ukraine

'Sadako Sasaki' is the girl that started making 1000 paper cranes and making them stand for 'peace'.

Sadako was at home when the nuclear bomb hit Hiroshima. In November 1954, Sadako developed swellings on her neck and behind her ears. In January 1955, purple spots had

formed on her legs. Subsequently, she was diagnosed with leukemia. She was hospitalized in February 1955, and given, at the most, a year to live.

In August 1955, Sadako's best friend Chizuko Hamamoto came to the hospital to visit and cut a golden piece of paper into a square to fold it into a paper crane, in reference to the ancient Japanese story that promises anyone who folds a thousand origami cranes will be granted a wish by the crane. Sadako decided she would try to do this though she fell short of her goal of folding 1000 cranes, having folded only 644 before her death, and her friends completed the rest and buried them with



We believe that this so called legend is true,

though instead of granting the maker a wish, the people that have lost many things should be granted one. We want to try and get this up and going, to help those innocent children and elders to find peace in their lives and have many paper cranes looking down at them and realize just how special they are. Sadako passed away in October 1955, at the age of 12, but many people believed it was right to help her finish what she had started.

In this bag are 10 Cranes for peace, each crane is \$5.00
