

Coronavirus restrictions easing from 11:59pm on 8th November 2020

Metropolitan Melbourne moves to expanded Third Step restrictions from 11:59pm on 8th November 2020. The main summary points are stated below (as chosen by the Bulletin Editor):

Stay Safe: no restrictions on reasons to leave home or distance but work from home if you can.

Work: Work: If you can work from home, you must work from home. No change.

Travel: The 25km limit is removed and the border around regional Victoria is also removed.

Overnight Accommodation: Overnight accommodation will be open for one single household plus two adults

and their children from another household.

Face Masks: Will still be compulsory . No change.

Home visitors: Victorians be allowed to have two different adult visitors and their dependents per day either separately

or together.

Aged Care & Hospital visitors: A household will be able to visit together, once per day for a limit of 2 hours.

Gyms & Physical Recreation: 20 people per venue and restricted to 10 people per space

Indoor Pools: Limit of 20 people

Cinemas: Limit of 20 per venue and limit of 20 per space

Libraries & Community Centres: Limit of 20 per venue and limit of 20 per space

Gatherings of People: Public gathering limit of 10 people still applies. Weddings also stays at 10 people

for both inside and outside ceremonies/receptions. No change

Restaurants & Cafes: Patronage can increase to 40 (from 20) inside and 70 (from 40) outside

Funerals: Will increase to 20 indoors and 50 outdoors


Faith gatherings: Will increase to 20 indoors and 50 outdoors
