#### **District Conference:**

Following District Conference last weekend end gone Ray Martin summarised some key presentations and moments at our Club meeting last Monday evening. Highlighting the messages of Kate Roffey, Ross Kilborn and Bernie Farquhar being particularly memorable to him. Ray also commented that, when asked in an interview how she saw Rotary Foundation, Rotary International President Jennifer Jones answered that it was "the economic engine that allows Rotary to do good in the world"

#### Mount Martha Life Saving Club:

At last Monday's Club meeting attended by Immediate Past District Governor Bill Degnan with wife Judy, we were host to Andrew Felsinger & Kaylee Ward from Mount Martha Life Saving Club, Paul Nitas from The Ross Trust/Hillview Quarries, Gary Sanford from the Mt Martha Community Bank and his wife Bronwyn, all long term supporters of our Club. Anne Shaw who was so instrumental in the success of our Australia Day event, introduced our guests and presented Andrew with a cheque for \$2,223.06. We also thanked Paul Nitas for \$1,000 which his Company provided to cover food cost at the BBQ. We are indebted also to Gary Sanford who provided coffees for all Rotarian and Volunteers at the Post Australia Day Flag Raising morning tea.

#### Mt Martha Stronger Community Grant Program:

Community Bank Mt Martha will have been open 12 years on 7th April 2023. In the first 6 years the Bank struggled for sufficient support from the local community to generate sufficient income to cover its running costs. It wasn't until 2017, with the appointment of Kerry Debernardi as its Manager that the footings (Deposits and Loans) of the branch went from \$75 million to \$115 million at the end of 2019. During these years the Bank start to make profits each year.

When Kerry retired at the end of 2019, Gary started as Branch Manager and the footings have **Merv Williams** grown to \$245 million approx. and with that increased income. **mervcris@bigg** 

Sponsorship, grants and donations funding to the local community has increased as follows, 2020 \$35K, 2021 \$80K, 2022 \$113k and year to date \$128K with \$200K anticipated for the full 2023 year.

This financial year we have also launched Mt Martha Stronger Community Grants, which was eligible to any not-for-profit organisation post coded 3934 or any not for profit that currently banks at Community Bank Mt Martha. We initially budgeted \$200,000 to fund this initiative, which has been increased to \$250,000. Applications had to be for capital works costs with a minimum of \$2,500 and maximum \$20,000 for each successful grant

Mt Martha Stronger Community Grant Program, which opened last October 2022 and closed in January 2023, then a local Consultation Committee finalised their recommendations for the breakup of the \$250,000, which were all approved at the Companies February 2023 Board meeting. Rotary Club of Mt Martha applied for \$20,000 to assist with replacement exercise equipment for the Dunn's Road Reserve, which was removed during Covid 19. At last Monday's meeting Gary was very pleased to advise that the Club were successful and would be receiving \$18,500. Gary thanked the Club and all of its members that bank at Community Bank Mt Martha because this is how these amounts are possible.


