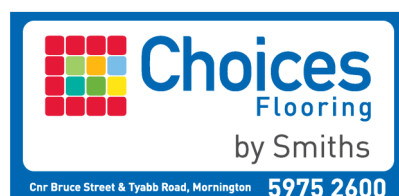
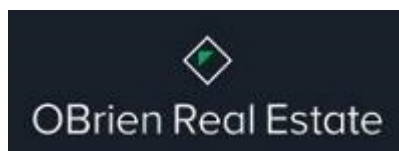

RCMM - \$1500 Donation to Shelter Box to support Flood Victims in Pakistan

Further to a recent request through an Emergency Appeal for funds, as outlined below from ShelterBox Australia, to support flood victims in Pakistan, the Rotary Club Mount Martha has again assisted with a donation of \$1,500.

As individual members of Rotary, we can only imagine the insurmountable challenges that would present for displaced families in Pakistan.

You may have seen the latest news from Pakistan, where flash floods have affected more than 30 million people, killing at least 1,000. people.

The sheer scale of the flooding is devastating. Tens of thousands of people have had to flee their homes, with this number expected to rise as the true scale of the destruction becomes clear.

Kitty Sadler, ShelterBox Emergency Co-ordinator, said: “After weeks of flooding, the heavy rains are not letting up – homes are being washed away, people are losing their livelihoods, and in too many cases their lives. With our experience supporting flood-affected communities in Pakistan in 2010, and flood-hit areas across the world, we’re looking to get an assessment team out there as soon as we can to see what we can do to help.”

The Rotary Foundation Areas of Focus

For more than 100 years, Rotarians have joined together to take action in our communities and around the world. We work together to empower youth, enhance health, promote peace, and advance the community. Rotary has focused its efforts in six areas, which reflect some of the critical and widespread humanitarian needs.

Promoting peace

Today, 42 million people are displaced by armed conflict or persecution. Through partnerships with several leading universities, Rotary Peace Fellows develop the skills to strengthen peace efforts, train local leaders to prevent and mediate conflict, and support long-term peace building in areas affected by conflict. We provide up to 100 peace fellowships per year at Rotary Peace Centers.

Fighting disease

More than 100 million people are pushed into poverty each year because of medical costs. Rotary aim to improve and expand access to low-cost and free health care in underdeveloped areas. Rotary members educate and mobilize communities to help prevent the spread of major diseases such as polio, HIV/AIDS, and malaria. Many of projects ensure that medical training facilities are located where the workforce lives.

Providing clean water

More than 2.5 billion people lack access to adequate sanitation facilities. At least 3,000 children die each day from diarrheal diseases caused by unsafe water. The projects done by Rotary give communities the ability to develop and maintain sustainable water and sanitation systems and support studies related to water and sanitation.

Saving mothers and children

At least 7 million children under the age of five die each year due to malnutrition, poor health care, and inadequate sanitation. To help reduce this rate, Rotary provide immunizations and antibiotics to babies, improve access to essential medical services, and support trained health care providers for mothers and their children. Rotary projects ensure sustainability by empowering the local community to take ownership of health care training programs.

Supporting education

Sixty-seven million children worldwide have no access to education and more than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate. The goal of Rotary in this issues is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy.

Growing local economies

Nearly 1.4 billion employed people live on less than \$1.25 a day. Rotary carries out service projects that enhance economic and community development and develop opportunities for decent and productive work for young and old. Rotary also help strengthen local entrepreneurs and community leaders, particularly women, in impoverished communities.

Tax deductible donations to the Centurion Club are paid to The Australian Rotary Foundation Trust, funds that are spent in Australia on Australian Rotary projects.

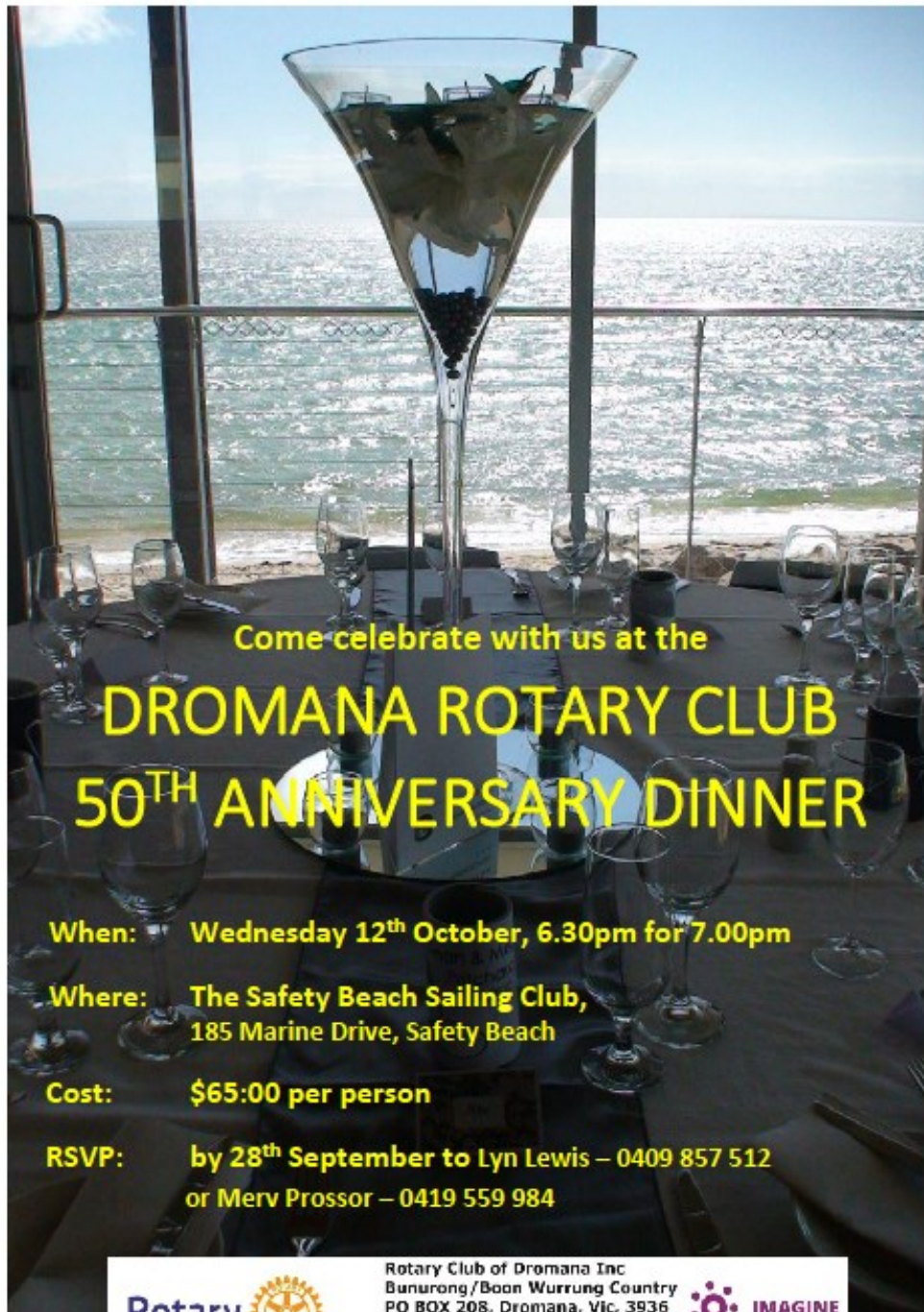

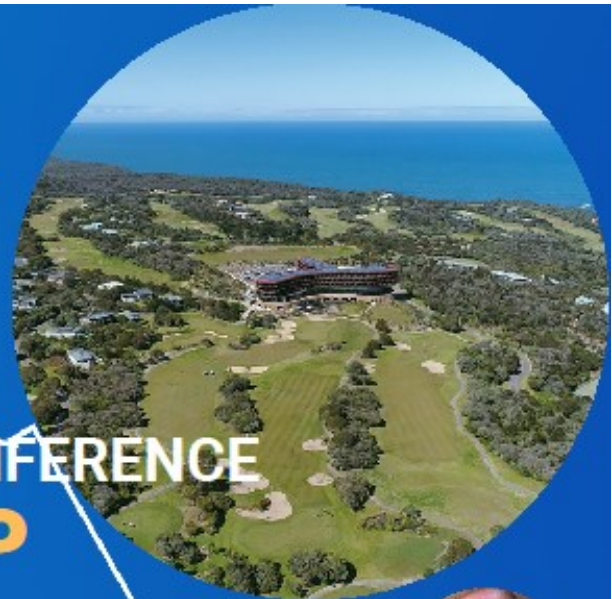
