My days have got busier. Each morning excluding Saturday & Sunday we have a one hour office meeting via Zoom. Once done I return messages and handle tasks that have come up either during the morning or remain incomplete from a previous day. From 10.30am I am mostly on the phone speaking to clients, with the lockdown the calls have got longer. Sometimes 20 calls can take 3-4 hours. I typically make calls through to a guick lunch break circa 1pm. Then back onto them as required.

My days are quite structured and I have two daughters studying, one in year 12 and the other 2nd year university.

We cannot conduct physical property inspections, in their place we conduct video walk throughs using Zoom. All contract related material is handled electronically so a learning curve there for me. Overall it's been good I'm learning some new skills and haven't gone mad yet. I've even created a weekly 2 minute video that I send to about 250 clients.

Usually have a walk for 30-60 minutes later in the day, then it's dinner time. I am certainly not bored and have no need to watch Netflix. I live by a quote from Joan Rivers which says it all. "I wish I could tell you that it gets better, but it doesn't get better. You get better."

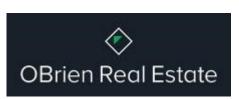




















OUR VIRTUAL CONFERENCE IS COMING!

Welcome to tomorrow - thank you to Roger Annear for this contribution (part 3 - final)

Not that long ago going to the moon was just a dream. Tomorrow is coming much sooner then what we ever thought possible.

This may sound a bit "Utopian" to us, however, the future is certainly arriving faster than we would like.

This is interesting. If you think the virus is going to make changes read this!

All of the following are forecasted to become reality in the next 10-20 years. Many of us won't see the changes, but our children and grandchildren probably will.

- 27 About 1.2 million people die each year in car accidents worldwide due to distracted or drunk driving. We now have one accident every 60,000 miles. With autonomous driving that will drop to 1 accident in 6 million miles. That will save more than a million lives worldwide each year.
- 28 Some traditional car companies will doubtless become bankrupt. They will try the evolutionary approach and just build a better car, while tech companies (Tesla, Apple, Google) will do the Revolutionary approach and build a computer on wheels.
- 29 Look at what Volvo is doing right now, having no more internal combustion engines in their vehicles... starting with their 2019 models that are all-electric or hybrid only, with the intent of phasing out the hybrid models.
- 30 Many engineers from Volkswagen and Audi are completely terrified of Tesla and they should be. Look at all the companies offering all-electric vehicles. That was unheard of only a few years ago.
- 31 Insurance companies will have massive trouble because, without accidents, the costs will become cheaper. Their auto insurance business model will disappear.
- 32 Real estate will change. If you can work from home (or from literally anywhere), people will abandon their towers to move far away to more beautiful affordable locations.
- 33 Electric cars will become mainstream about 2030. Cities will be less noisy because all new cars will run on electricity.
- 34 Cities will have much cleaner air as well.
- 35 Electricity will become incredibly cheap and clean.
- 36 Solar production has been on an exponential curve for 30 years, but you can now see the burgeoning impact. And it's just getting ramped up.
- 37 Fossil energy companies are desperately trying to limit access to the grid to prevent competition from home solar installations, but that simply cannot continue technology will take care of that strategy.
- 38 Health: "Tricorder X" will be announced this year. There are companies who will build a medical device (called the Tricorder from Star Trek) that works with your phone taking your retina scan, your blood sample, and you breathe into it. It then analyses 54 bio-markers that will identify nearly any disease. There are dozens of phone apps out right now for health.

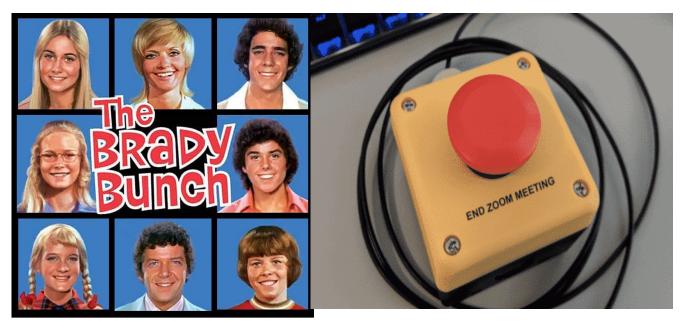
