Board Meeting notes

I wanted to make the members aware that the Board, having discussed concerns raised during the Club meeting in December, have now provided some observations that we will discuss at this Monday's scheduled Club meeting.

Rotarian Gordon Morriss

Thank you to Heather Morriss for keeping me informed on the health of Gordon since the mild stroke that he suffered on the morning of Sunday 8th January. I also wish to thank Peter Rawlings for his constant communication during the days that followed.

I spoke with Gordon yesterday and he wanted to thank all Rotarians for their concern and kind wishes, he is deeply appreciative of the communications he has received from members during the last week. He is now recovering at home, feeling much better and generally showing improvement, although fatigue persists to a degree. Gordon is hoping to be well enough to return to meetings as soon as he can.

For those who are not aware, Gordon Morriss began to experience unfamiliar feelings, slurred speech and trouble with balance early on the morning of Sunday 8th. Suspecting the symptoms were that of a stroke, his wife Heather took him to Frankston Hospital ED. Following a significant number of tests, the stroke team determined that Gordon had definitely suffered a mild stroke.

After being admitted to a ward, Gordon's condition continued to be monitored & he had further tests. The most noticeable symptoms he had were facial droop, slurred speech & weakness in his limbs. Fortunately Gordon's condition continued to improve and after a very stressful 2 and 1/2 days he was sent home on Tuesday afternoon.

Gordon's speech is now virtually normal and apart from some limb weakness, the improvement has been remarkable. Because of the stroke he is not allowed to drive for the next month.

I wish Gordon a full and complete recovery and do look forward to welcoming him back to a meeting soon.

Gordon's happy to receive messages from you all but for now he'd like to keep calls to a minimum.


